- ✓ To ensure that the selection of commissioners and the process of drawing legislative boundaries are transparent and accessible to the public.
- ✓ To inform a broad base of Californians about the process and provide tools to help them participate.
- ✓ To ensure that public participation throughout the process reflects California's diverse population.
